

**Early Notice and Public Review of a Proposed
Activity in a Floodplain and Wetland**

To: All interested Agencies, Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Florida Division of Emergency Management, Volusia County, and any other applicable Groups and Individuals.

This is to give notice that The Volusia County as the Responsible Entity under 24 CFR Part 58 has determined that the following proposed action under HUD grant B-23-UN-12-0005 is located in the floodplain and wetland, and Volusia County will be identifying and evaluating practicable alternatives to locating the action within the wetland and the potential impacts on the wetland from the proposed action, as required by Executive Orders 11988 and 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 in Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands.

The proposed project location is a length of North Beach Street between the Tomoka River and Pine Tree Drive in Ormond Beach, Volusia County, FL. This project will elevate this portion of North Beach Street approximately 3 feet by adding fill material to the existing grade. The new fill material will require removing vegetation from the existing grade, and new vegetation will be planted in its place once the new grade is established. The area of this project is approximately 2.3 acres. The length of North Beach Street runs through Wetlands E2EM1Nd (Estuarine and Marine Wetland) and E1UBL (Estuarine and Marine Deepwater). This project area also falls within Special Flood Hazard area AE (100 year floodplain) as determined by FEMA's National Flood Hazard Layer (NFHL), panels 1217C0202K and 1217C0204K.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in the floodplain and wetland and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Commenters are encouraged to offer alternative sites outside of the floodplain and wetland, alternative methods to serve the same project purpose, and methods to minimize and mitigate project impacts on the floodplain and wetland. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information and request for public comment about the floodplain and wetland can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks and impacts associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in the floodplain and wetland, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.
