Hurricane Ian Portal Closes as Hurricane Milton Portal **Prepares to Open This Summer**

Important! The application period for Hurricane lan assistance officially closed on April 29 at 11:59 p.m. The portal is no longer accepting new applications.

Looking ahead, the application period for Hurricane Milton assistance is anticipated to open mid-summer. We encourage residents who were affected by Hurricane Milton to stay connected and watch for updates regarding the launch of the new application portal. >>> MULTI-FAMILY HOUSING

Another important initiative by Transform386 is the Multi-Family Housing Program. This program provides gap funding to help cover costs that go beyond what is already available for building new multi-family housing developments. Through this program, Transform386 supports the creation of affordable housing options for low-income families and seniors, helping to ensure that safe, stable homes are available to those who need them most.

The program is growing fast:

- 4 new projects approved by County Council.
- 260 new units coming, 136 for seniors and 40 will be direct replacement of Hurricane lan damaged units.
- Environmental reviews are already underway!
